CONFLICT OF MINERALS POLICY**

It is the policy of Castings Technology International to conduct all business activities in compliance with the rules and regulations applicable to our industry and the laws in the countries in which the company operates.

Castings Technology International's reputation is built on the organisation's integrity and commitment to maintaining the highest standard of business practice. This includes responsible manufacturing of our products and responsible sourcing of materials.

Castings Technology requires its suppliers to share in this commitment and has established the Castings Technology International Code of Conduct, which outlines our expectations of Castings Technology suppliers in conducting business in a legal, ethical, and responsible manner.

As a responsible company, Castings Technology International supports the goal of the Dodd-Frank Act of preventing armed groups in the Democratic Republic of the Congo and adjoining countries from benefitting from the sourcing of Conflict Minerals from that region. This Policy shows Castings Technology International commitment and its expectations for its product suppliers regarding actions to address Conflict Minerals.

We are committed to complying with any requirements applicable to our Company under the Conflict Minerals Rule and will work to understand and trace the 3TG (tin, tungsten, tantalum, and gold, or "3TG") minerals that are contained within the products coming from the supply chain.

OUR COMMITMENT:

1. Support the aims and objectives of the Dodd-Frank Act concerning Conflict Minerals sourcing by working to educate the suppliers of products we consume in our manufacturing process about Conflict Minerals.
2. Strive to work cooperatively with customers and our suppliers understand the due diligence steps they can take to investigate the source of any Conflict Minerals in the products they sell to Castings Technology International.
3. Not continue to source from a supplier any product that contains Conflict Minerals if Castings Technology determines the product is not DRC Conflict Free and the supplier fails to implement reasonable steps to transition to DRC Conflict Free sources.
4. Confirmation from our supply chain on compliance and commitment to sourcing materials responsibly.


